

PUBLIC COMMENT AT RTA BOARD MEETINGS

Persons wishing to comment at an RTA Board meeting must submit a request in advance and follow the rules outlined below.

1. Public comment will be permitted at each RTA Board meeting at a time specified in the meeting agenda. Comments should address matters that pertain to the RTA or transportation issues.
2. Each person who will address the Board will be given 3 minutes to speak. Up to 5 people will be permitted to speak at each meeting.
3. You **MUST** submit the attached Public Comment/Disclaimer Form in advance if you wish to speak at an RTA Board meeting. Your request to speak must include your name; the organization you work for or represent, if any; the general subject you wish to speak about; and your contact information. You must also agree to all terms set forth in the disclaimer portion on the second page of the attached form before you will be permitted to address the Board.

The Public Comment/Disclaimer Form must be completed and returned to the Board Secretary at least 3 days before the day of the Board meeting. The dates of the meetings are posted under the RTA meeting documents section of this website. You may submit the Public Comment/Disclaimer Form via email at boardsecretary@rtachicago.org, with the subject identified as "Request to Speak" or you may print out the form and fax it to the Board Secretary at (312) 913-3216 or mail or drop it off to the attention of the Board Secretary at the RTA main office, 175 W. Jackson Boulevard., Suite 1550, Chicago, IL 60604.

4. The Board Secretary will contact you to let you know if you are on the schedule to speak. If more than 5 persons ask to speak at a meeting, priority may be given to those persons who have not already addressed the RTA Board during the calendar year. If too many people want to speak at a particular Board meeting, some of those wishing to speak may have to wait until a future meeting to do so.
5. On the day of the Board meeting, you must check in with the Board Secretary to let her know you are in attendance. When it is time for public comment, the Board Secretary will call you up to address the Board. You will be asked to begin by stating your name, any organization you may be representing and the city and county of your residence. You will then be allowed to speak for 3 minutes. The Board Secretary will keep track of the time and advise you when time is up.
6. In order to permit a diversity of viewpoints to be heard, each individual will only be permitted to address the Board once every three months. In addition, speakers who violate these rules may not be allowed to speak in the future.
